IMAGINATIVE SONGWRITING

We are going to write a song together! But what shall we write about? Finding inspiration and ideas for songs can be tricky at first. You just need that lightbulb moment. But to switch your creative lightbulb on, we first need to warm it up so have a go trying these creative exercises to help you.

POSTCARD PICTURES:

Pick a postcard or image you are drawn to (on the next page) or find your own postcard or photo that you love.

Describe what you see:

- where is it?
- who is in the picture?
- what can you see?
- when was this taken?

Describe what you feel:

- Does it make you feel hopeful, excited, happy or joyful?
- Does it make you feel scared, intrigued, curious or disgusted?
- Does the postcard picture tell a story?

Write your song title;

Think of a main theme or topic that this postcard is saying.

Is it a love story; a story in space; a ridiculous adventure story?

Come up with your song title; Aliens on the Beach | Hold Me

Jungle Jiggles | Rise Above The Mountains | Beach Party

- What FEELINGS or DESCRIBING WORDS does it make you feel or see?





SANDWICH SONGWRITING

WARM UP ACTIVITY: FREE FLOW LYRICS

I LOVE that we are so rich with amazing lyrics in our lyric bank. We have all the tools we need to go ahead and write some lyrics for our song.

A little warm up activity called Free Flow Lyrics will help us get in the lyric groove! Think of your song theme/topic/title and look to your lyric bank and just start free flow writing for 1 minute any ideas in one continuous block of writing.



SANDWICH SONGWRITING

Songs all have a structure which is a bit like making a sandwich. Imagine your song as a sandwich...the bread slices are the VERSES and the filling is the CHORUS.

Have a go at writing your filling - the CHORUS first (the chorus is often the main message of the song).

Then try writing the bread slices - the VERSES (the verse often set the scene and introduce the song). The bread slices to go either side of your chorus.


- The VERSE often starts the story of the song and starts to set the scene.
- The CHORUS often tells the main message of the story.

EXTRA COLOUR

If you want to add some extra colour then why not use a backing track or write you own chords as the accompaniment.

An easy start on the ukulele could be to choose these chords C G Am F. Then add some melody (the tune) to your lyrics (the words).



HERE'S SOME IDEAS OF HOW YOU COULD DO THIS!


- Write up your lyrics on a poster and share a photo of this.
